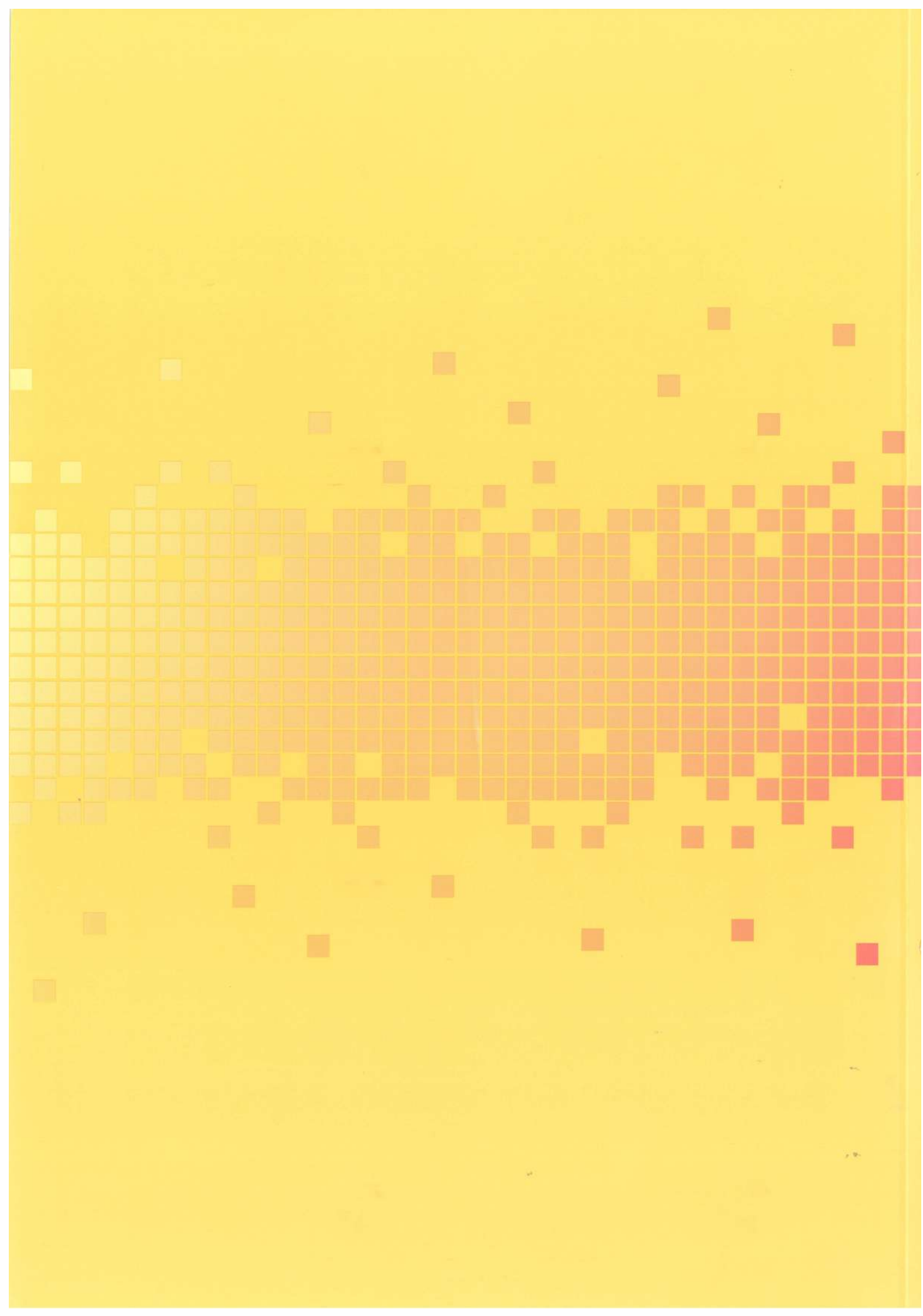

There is no doubt that there has been a high level of activity in all areas of water safety over the past twelve months. The overall pleasing note is the continuing focus on the drowning toll in Victoria during this period, resulting in a reduction in the rolling average.

This result could not have been achieved without the dedicated contribution of the volunteers, members and staff working together for the common goal. These efforts were spread across the provision of education and training programs and the traditional lifesaving services. Whilst on membership, it is pleasing to note the significant increase in numbers during the current period.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the State Government of Victoria through their various agencies for this support and look forward to strengthening this relationship in the future.

In addition to the Victorian Government, I would like to thank all sponsors of LSV for their support. In particular, I would like to highlight the significant contribution DHL, Telstra, Westpac and Yamaha make to the overall operation of LSV. I am certain that without this support LSV would not be able to provide the service it does currently to the public of Victoria. The support of Surf Life Saving Australia and the Royal Life Saving Society of Australia should also be noted. Thank you.

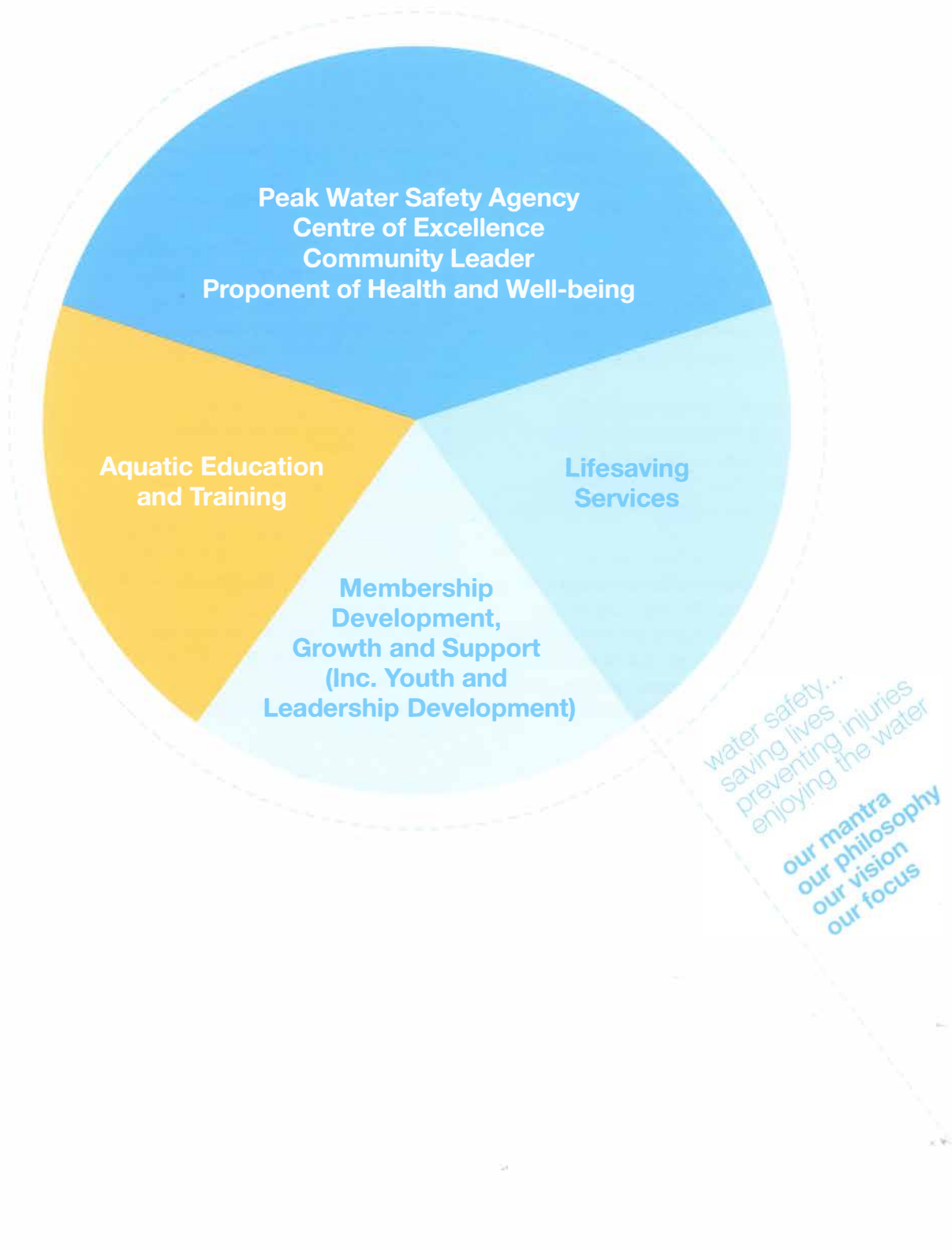
As well as the increase in membership, which I have already mentioned, I would like to make note of a number of highlights which have occurred throughout the year.

- The Year of the Surf Lifesaver was not only recognition of the major contribution the movement has made in its 100 years of operation, but also significantly increased the awareness of LSV to the population at large.
- The reduction in the drowning rate to an all time low.
- The manner in which members and staff have represented the State in a wide range of activities covering resource development through to National and International competitions.
- The focus on inclusion and the winning of the Unity Foundation's contribution to Indigenous Communities.
- The ongoing use of the LSV training facility at Port Melbourne and in particular the junior development camps.
- The recognition of members for their particular contribution to the movement and the community. This includes Barbara Morgan for her Order of Australia and her inclusion on the Victorian Women's Honour Roll for her significant contribution to the Victorian community.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the LSV Board for their support and contribution and to the CEO Nigel Taylor and his staff for the effort they made to the overall delivery of the Strategic plan.

Again it has been an extremely busy year for Life Saving Victoria. The following pages are presented for your information and to provide an outline of the broad scope of LSV's activities.

Highlights for the year were:

- Acceptance by the International Organisation for Standardisation of work undertaken here in Victoria over the past ten years on open water, pools and coastal signage. This signage is now the International standard.
- Introduction of full time staff members to deal with water safety issues for newly arrived and Indigenous communities.
- SLSA Life Membership being presented to Mike Martin and Rick Mitchell.
- An Order of Australia Medal presented to Barbara Morgan.
- Whilst still too high, over the last four years (since the introduction of LSV) the drowning toll in Victoria has averaged 41.2. The lowest average drowning toll recorded to date.
- A 14% increase in volunteer membership to 22,268.
- LSV being presented with the Unity Foundations Award for "Contribution to the Indigenous Community".
- A very significant donation from the Harris Family Foundation to support the Building Future Leaders Scholarship program.

In summary, LSV's fourth year has been one in which LSV has begun to settle into what would be considered its normal activity. The merger, the transfer of lifesaving services and programs to the Department of Justice, the 2006 World Life Saving Titles, the Year of the Surf Lifesaver and the construction of a new education, training and administration facility are now behind us. It has been an exciting, tumultuous and very draining period.

In a perfect world, these activities would have been handled over a longer period of time and in a more sequential order but we can never control our external environment and need to be ready to move as the opportunity arises. Having said that and as noted above, on two key assessment indicators LSV has seen the trends move in the right direction – those being membership and the drowning toll.

It has also been pleasing to see that as one of the State's leading community based organisations we have been able to establish a cohesive working relationship with the government as we work towards the further development of a multifaceted Victorian water safety policy and related strategic plan.

However, it is now four years since the two lifesaving organisations came together to form Life Saving Victoria. The LSV Board have determined that the organisation should move through a strategic review process with a view to assessing if, with four years experience behind us, we feel some elements of LSV could be fine tuned to better serve our members, stakeholders and the Victorian public in general.

This review will take into account what we are currently doing and will also consider the fact that Victoria's population continues to grow, particularly in coastal areas. Equally, the mix of diverse cultural backgrounds will only increase and climate change appears to be delivering longer, hotter summers, lower water levels in inland waterways and an increasing number of storm events and storm surges. Economically it appears the short term will see a decline in levels of prosperity and sustainable practises will become a part of our everyday life. LSV will need to continue to respond to all of these in a meaningful way.

As we look back over the year and as we move through the development phases of LSV, we need to acknowledge our reliance on many supporters to ensure our ongoing success. For their assistance we note our appreciation for the bipartisan support from Sport and Recreation Victoria, the Department of Justice's Office of the Emergency Services Commissioner and in particular Ministers Bob Cameron and James Merlino, the Commissioner of Emergency Services, Bruce Esplin and his water safety office.

We also note our very sincere appreciation of the work of the SLS Foundation for their input into our fundraising in all its forms. In the sponsorship area we acknowledge the generous assistance provided by DHL, Westpac, Telstra, VicHealth and others as noted on various pages within this report. We could not function as a key community strengthening agent, without your encouragement and contributions.

I would also like to express my sincere appreciation of the commitment and enthusiasm demonstrated by Mike and the Board, the officers, members and staff of Life Saving Victoria and the national offices of both Surf and Royal Life Saving.

The club development work that has been undertaken over the past few years is now showing dividends with our base becoming increasingly stronger. This year saw a 14% increase in membership across the State and our best season in meeting minimum patrolling standards.

More than 3 million visitations were recorded at patrolled beaches, an increase of 400,000 on the previous season. In all, 798 rescues were recorded and more than 48,000 preventative actions took place. Lifesavers responded to 1,934 First-Aid incidents, including 128 major First-Aid incidents where people required further medical treatment.

The season also saw the profile of Life Saving Victoria's service grow through the 'Year of the Surf Lifesaver' and television shows such as Surf Patrol. More than 2,000 news articles, TV and radio media hits during the season contributed to the increased profile at a local and State level.

Services

Portland SLSC commenced patrols at Narrawong Beach as a response to the increasing population attending this dangerous location.

Further expansion in services included the introduction of offshore craft at Port Fairy and Pier 35 (Melbourne). The Coastal watch surveillance camera system was improved with 10 sites now within the management system.

Increasingly LSV services are being called upon to assist other Emergency Service organisations. Over 150 incidents occurred where LSV services were asked to assist.

Air and Marine Search and Rescue Services

The Air and Marine Search and Rescue Committee was formed to assist with the strategic direction and to support the expanding number of services participating in incidents away from the beach. By the end of the season there were 14 services actively participating in Search and Rescue activities.

LSV also received a gift of two Atlantic 21 Rigid Hulled Inflatable Rescue Craft from the Royal National Lifeboat Institution in the UK.

The two craft have been deployed to Pier 35 in a response to drownings in the Docklands and the Yarra and Maribyrnong Rivers.

A new guide for clubs wishing to affiliate or expand services was developed and endorsed by the LSV Board of Directors. This document will guide all new services and ensure they are established in line with best practices and further strengthen the organisation in its goal to prevent aquatic related death and injury.

The two Westpac aircraft operated effectively this season responding to 49 incidents and flying over 450 patrolling hours. The service was also utilised by the CSIRO for shark research.

Communication System

The first stage of the new LSV Communication network was completed prior to the patrolling season. The new Omnitronics DX64 system housed at the communications centre in Port Melbourne was built incorporating UHF and SMR networks as well as beach surveillance cameras and significant backup power. During the season significant funds were also established to commence stage two of the network which is planned for finalisation prior to the 2008/09 season.

Over \$1.3 million in grants was made available to support the provision of lifesaving services across Victoria during the 2007/08 season.

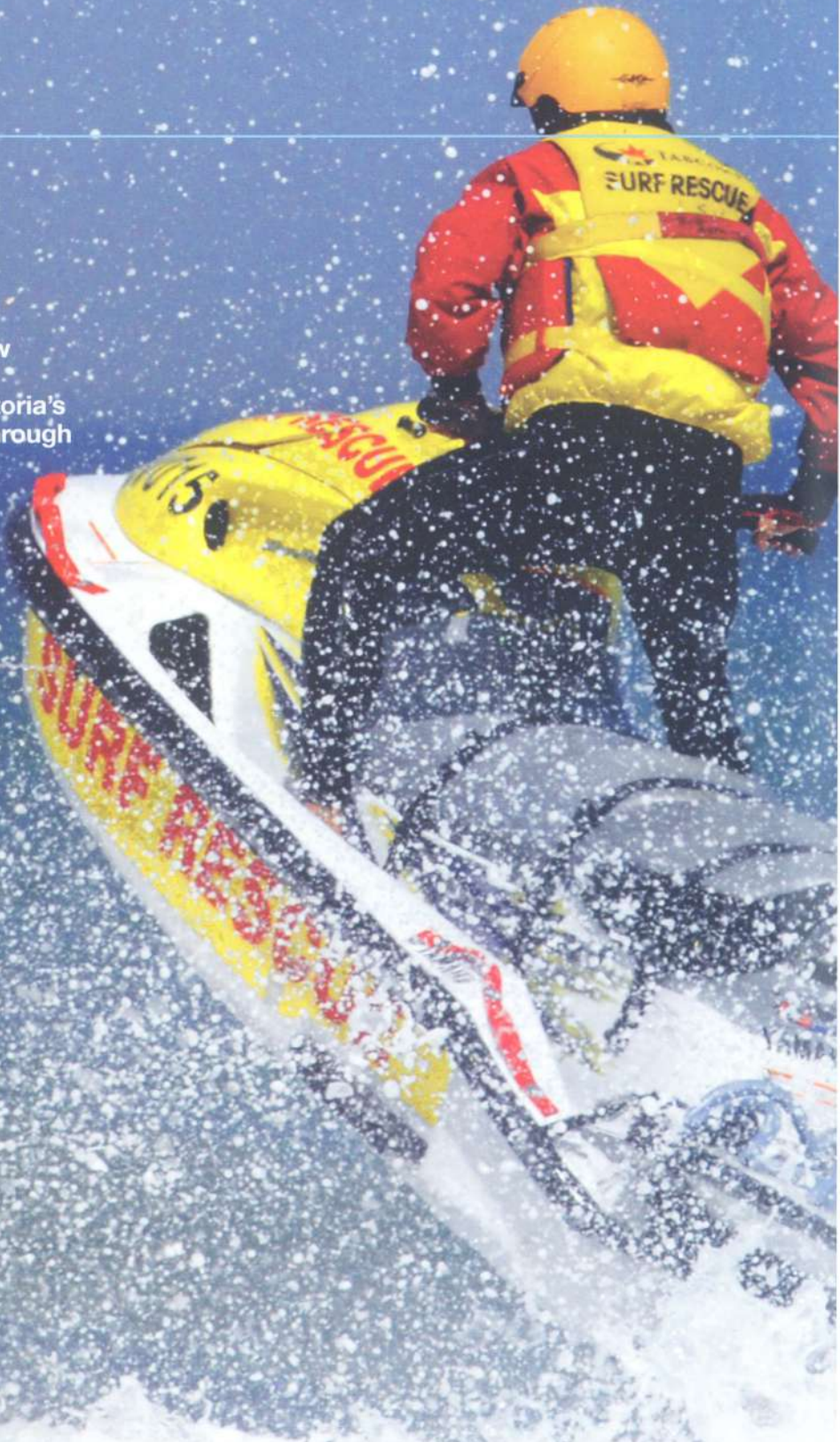

Club Development

Much effort was placed on developing the capacity and strength of the smaller clubs to undertake patrols and club management activities. Staff and volunteers directly assisted with the delivery and facilitation of hundreds of core qualifications across these clubs and spent many hours building the capacity of the clubs to manage members and expand capabilities.

Paid Lifeguard Services

The service has grown this year to comprise 33 lifeguard sites from Mallacoota in the East to Port Fairy in the West and includes the pool complex at Eastern Beach in Geelong where a seven (7) day service operates during the peak and extended periods and then reverts to normal times in line with the volunteer services.

Support was also provided to Kennett River with extra funding provided by Colac Otway Shire. There has been interest in an increase of services for the Ocean Grove/Barwon Heads area as well as preliminary discussions regarding Narrawong via Portland.

Great support is also provided by participating lifesaving clubs within the scheme. The Advanced Lifesaving/Lifeguard Camp held at Lorne each year goes from strength to strength with not only an emphasis on fitness and skills but also leadership and management development.

The Lifeguard Exchange Program between Victoria and the RNLI provided two (2) lifeguards from the UK the opportunity to work on our beaches prior to and during the lifeguard service period. This is an opportunity also for two (2) Victorian lifeguards each year to nominate for selection to work in the UK during our colder winter months.

Lifeguards this season carried out over 370 rescues, performed almost 24,000 preventative actions, provided minor and major first aid treatment to 681 patients and returned over 140 lost children to their parents or guardians.

Many thanks to all those who have assisted with the management and development of the program.

Event Lifeguard Services continued strongly with a variety of requests for many and varied programs which included:

The Youth + Leadership Development Council (Y+LD) has completed another successful season. The delivery of high quality leadership programs and an increase in nipper and competition numbers were highlights of another incredible season.

Thank you to the Y+LD Executive Council, volunteers and staff for their ongoing commitment to the Youth of Life Saving Victoria and affiliated Community Groups in delivering all LSV programs within budget.



Leadership + Development

Life Saving Victoria's State Headquarters in Port Melbourne was home to two Under 13 Development Camps in 2007 – 2008. 64 Under 13's from over 20 of Victoria's Life Saving Clubs attended the two day camp which was well received by all. The demand for the Under 13 Camp has reached a new high in season 2007 – 2008 with over 100 participants nominated through their clubs to attend. The demand is such that LSV will offer a third camp in season 2008 – 2009.

The Under 15 Leadership + Development camp was again a success in the tranquil surroundings of the Dandenong's in Yellingbo. 40 quality participants from 18 lifesaving clubs attended the three day camp. Problem solving exercises, personal challenges, trust and teamwork exercises provided the participants with the tools to further their leadership skills within their lifesaving clubs now and into the future.

The Building Leaders Scholarship has been revamped in 2008 after a review of the 2007 program. The scholars will work closely within an area of their interest over a 12 month period and will apply the leadership skills and knowledge that they will gain to their projects, their personal development and to their club or community group in the future.

This year's camp candidates were required to apply for a position on the Development Programs. The process provided LSV's youth with a chance to practice their job application skills such as cover letter and résumé preparation and formal interviews. The Leadership Team noticed several flow on affects from the application process including an increase in the calibre of participants and their general attitude towards the program.

The trialling of the Under 18 Leadership + Development Program occurred in July. The plan of an ongoing program to complete the full leadership pathway in Victoria was a success and will be a part of leadership and development in future years.

The Youth Involvement Program (YIP's) also started to blossom in 2007 – 2008 with over 10 clubs running the program with great results. Over 140 members across Victoria enrolled in the rewards structured program with more set to join next season. Brothers from Angelsea – Jonathon Levin – Age 20 Years and Ben Levin – Age 18 Years completed their Gold YIP's last season after 4 years of service to both Angelsea and Port Melbourne clubs.

Junior Sports

This area of Y+LD activities continued with steady growth across all carnivals culminating with the extremely successful State Championships at Lakes Entrance in March 2008.

Over 1,000 competitors competed at the Championships with some great results emerging from across all six age groups. Point Leo SLSC emerged as the overall points winner. The weather for the event was brilliant and the support from the Lakes Entrance SLSC was exceptional.

In 2007/2008 over 2,800 participants attended the State Carnivals and over 1,800 attended the Regional Carnivals. Clubs like Rosebud, Brighton, Hampton and Bonbeach all emerged with more participants over the summer months.

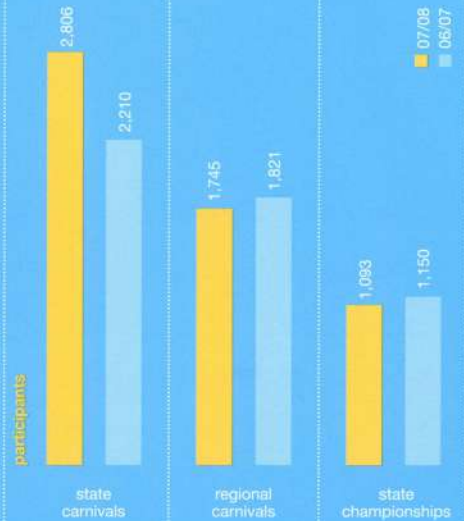
At the elite national level the Victorian Juniors finished fourth at the Interstates, one position lower than last season. In 2009 the Interstates will be held in Perth in conjunction with the Australian Championships. The Development Team performed exceptionally at Ocean Grove SLSC clearly dominating their Southern State counterparts, South Australia and Tasmania.

Nippers

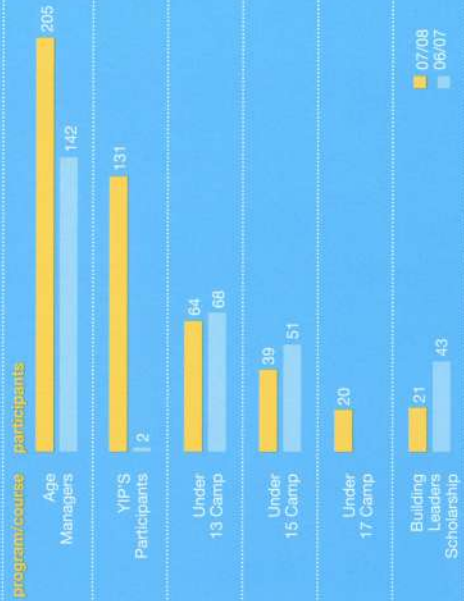
With a warmer and longer summer came an increase in Nipper numbers again in Victoria in 2007/2008. Over 7,500 juniors registered for Nippers in Victoria and this number is tipped to exceed 8,000 next season. Clubs like Anglesea, Fairhaven, Brighton, Hampton and Torquay experienced huge numbers and are now looking at new ways to manage capacity. 2007/2008 also saw the start of Nippers at Seaford LSC with a small number competing at the Peninsula Regionals in February.

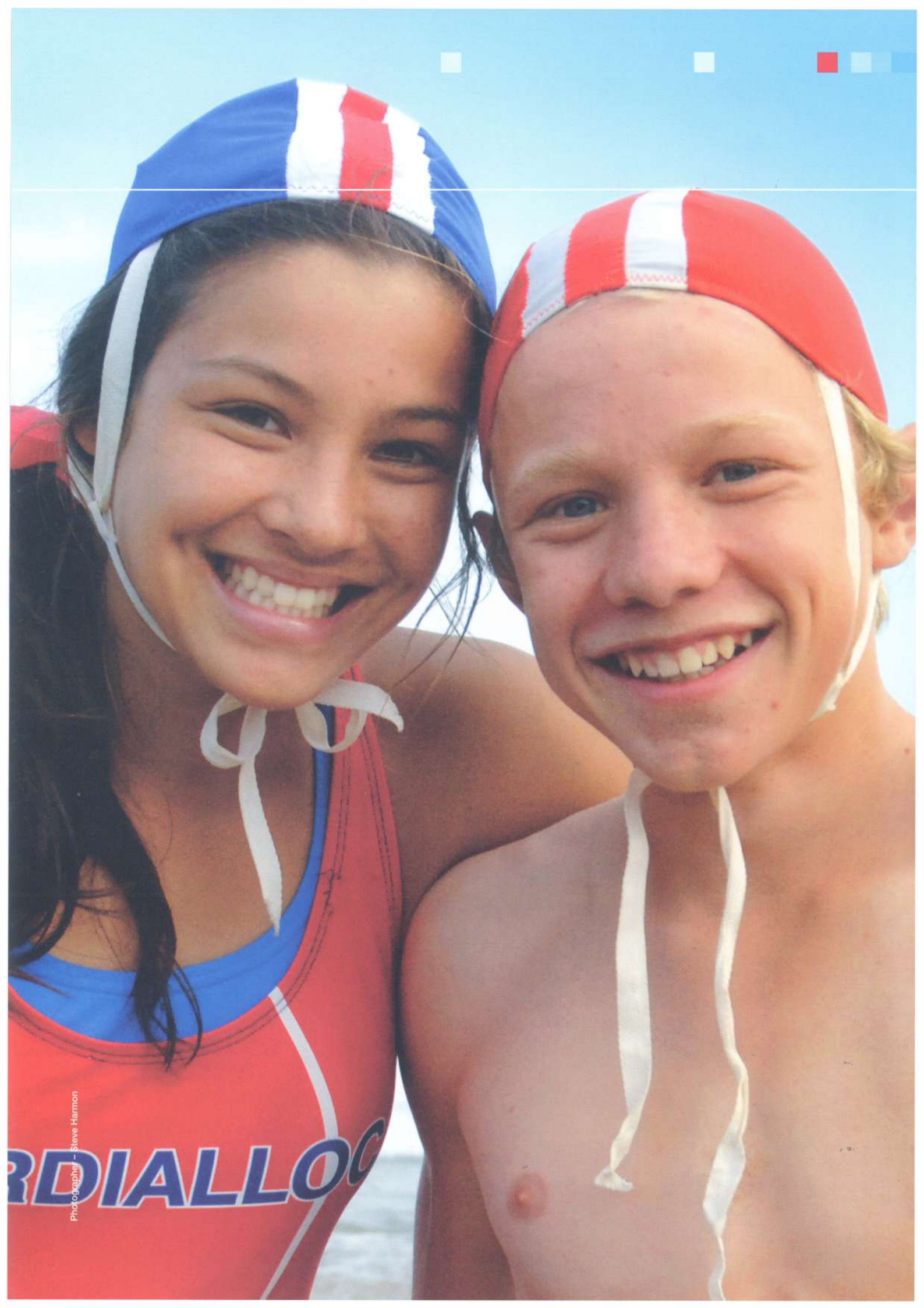
Surf Education Certificates were another hit this season as the Nippers learned how to be safe in and around the beach environment. Making the Surf Education programs possible were the hundreds of volunteer parents who assisted in the running of Nipper programs. Over 200 keen parents completed their Age Managers Course. The course is now more accessible with the introduction of an online course via the Life Saving Victoria website.

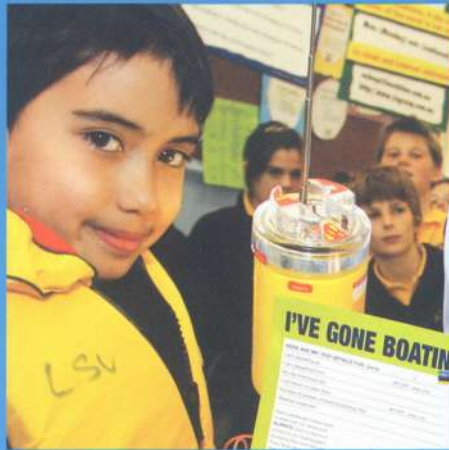

Education + Training

Life Saving Victoria delivers an extensive number of programs and produces a wide range of resources for lifesaving clubs, schools and the community, making us the leading provider of water safety education and training in Victoria.

Over the past twelve months we have begun to see the benefits of amalgamating the Education and Training department through collaboration of staff knowledge, which in turn has increased efficiency in the delivery of programs to schools and the community. The past year has seen a focus on training and professional development of our Trainer and Assessor networks to ensure consistency across all our programs.

The ongoing development of the Australian Lifesaving Academy has brought new marketing opportunities and a national approach to resource development which will continue to enhance the consistently high quality of training we deliver.

Training Services

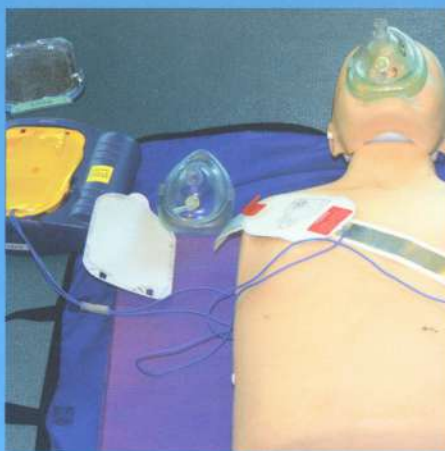
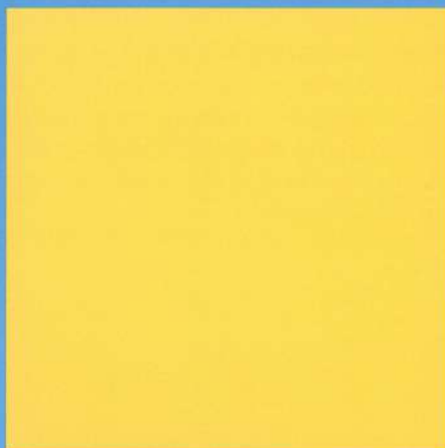
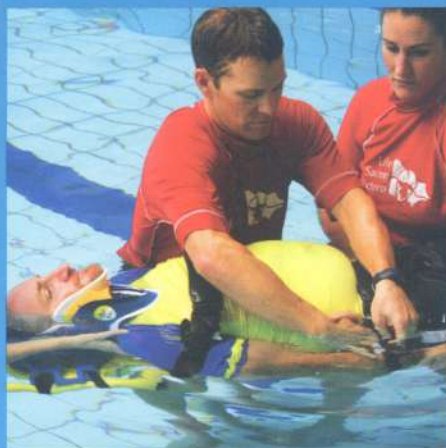
Life Saving Victoria provides a wide range of accredited Aquatic and First Aid training to the Victorian Community through commercial training programs, community lifesaving training and Life Saving Club training.

In mentioning only a fragment of what our training department delivers; this year saw the release of the 4th Edition Pool Lifeguarding Manual and related resources which will keep this course in line with industry needs and improve national consistency in Lifeguard training.

The Community Surf Lifesaving Certificate proved to be a very popular choice. Aimed at teachers and the general community, the course builds knowledge and rescue skills appropriate for supervising groups who recreate in coastal and open waterways.

CPR and First Aid Courses are set to boom with the introduction of new and unique resources which will enable us to meet diverse client needs and deliver high quality training to varying groups.

Education Services

Life Saving Victoria's Education Services provide a diverse range of programs that teach students, teachers and the community about water safety and lifesaving skills. The Education Programs are offered at a variety of venues including classrooms, swimming pools and open waterways and include the following:

Resuscitate a Mate

The key messages and elements in the Resuscitate a Mate program equips upper primary and lower secondary students with the skills and knowledge to know what to do in an emergency situation which involves gaining basic knowledge of first aid and the importance of resuscitation techniques. This program exceeded expectations in 2007/08, covering more regional areas across Victoria and reaching more schools throughout the Melbourne metropolitan area.

Meet a Lifeguard

Flexibility is a key element of the Meet a Lifeguard program allowing a diverse range of people to benefit from important lifesaving messages. Most popular in the warmer months, the year round interactive program educates people throughout Victoria. Visiting many schools and community groups Meet a Lifeguard ensures participants receive information to make safe aquatic related decisions when enjoying the inland, pool and coastal environments.

Boating Safety for Kids

The Boating Safety for Kids award-winning program, funded by Marine Safety Victoria, is run in conjunction with Yachting Victoria and is designed to educate students in the safety considerations when boating on any waterway. Now in it's fourth year, the program's aims and outcomes are coming to fruition.

Telstra Beach to Bush

This nationally sponsored program toured regional Victoria throughout December taking the beach to the bush by educating students about aquatic hazards with a major emphasis on beach and surf safety and the role of a lifeguard.

Beach Programs

The tailor made summer Beach Program combines a mix of theoretical and practical activities to engage students in learning about beach safety and awareness along with a variety of lifesaving skills. This program is delivered to students from Grade 3 to Year 12 and encourages students to enjoy the beach safely.

Open Water Learning Experience (OWLE)

The Open Water Learning Experience (OWLE), which is supported by the Play It Safe by the Water campaign, is a fun and educational program that provides a practical approach to familiarising students with open water environments. All activities can be conducted in a range of open water environments including rivers, lakes, beaches and dams.

Telegames

The Pool Lifesaving Telegames is a diverse and challenging event that consists of modified lifesaving activities that enables every student involved to learn aquatic lifesaving skills while getting active, having fun and being part of a team. Students compete in both team and individual events within their respective region and results, which are published online, allowing students to compare their results against other participants across the State.

School Surf League

The School Surf League is an exciting summer event in the school sports calendar. The competition aims to provide secondary school students with an alternative sporting experience that tests endurance, strength, speed and agility in the most natural sporting arena – the beach.

Advance

Through Advance, a Victorian government program for youth development, Life Saving Victoria has formed and maintained links with schools from across the State, providing them with strong community links and recognised training such as the SLSA Bronze Star, SLSA Bronze Medallion, RLSSA Bronze Rescue programs and First Aid courses.

Swim + Survive

Swim and Survive is a national program licensed to schools and facilities that provides a broad balance of swimming, water safety and survival skills which is essential for every child's safety in aquatic environments. We have seen more schools choosing the Swim and Survive program as it links to the Victorian Essential Learning Standards (VELS) allowing schools to achieve the standards required in their Health and Physical Education Domain.

Bronze Rescue

The awards within the Bronze Rescue structure give participants the knowledge and skills to be able to make the right survival decision and instinctive responses that may help them or those around them survive an aquatic emergency.

Infant Aquatics

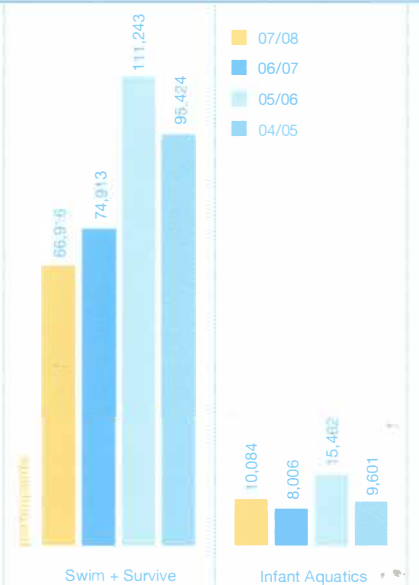
Infant Aquatics is an early introduction into the water environment, for children aged 6 months to 5 years, providing an opportunity for children to experience water in a safe and enjoyable manner. This program is popular with parents wanting their toddlers to be more aware around the water.

Junior Lifeguard Club

The Junior Lifeguard Club offers a unique aquatic alternative for those who love the water, need a challenge and want an alternative to traditional swimming lessons. The program gives children aged 5-15 years the ability to form pathways into future employment within the aquatic industry.



Swim + Survive and Infant Aquatics Comparisons





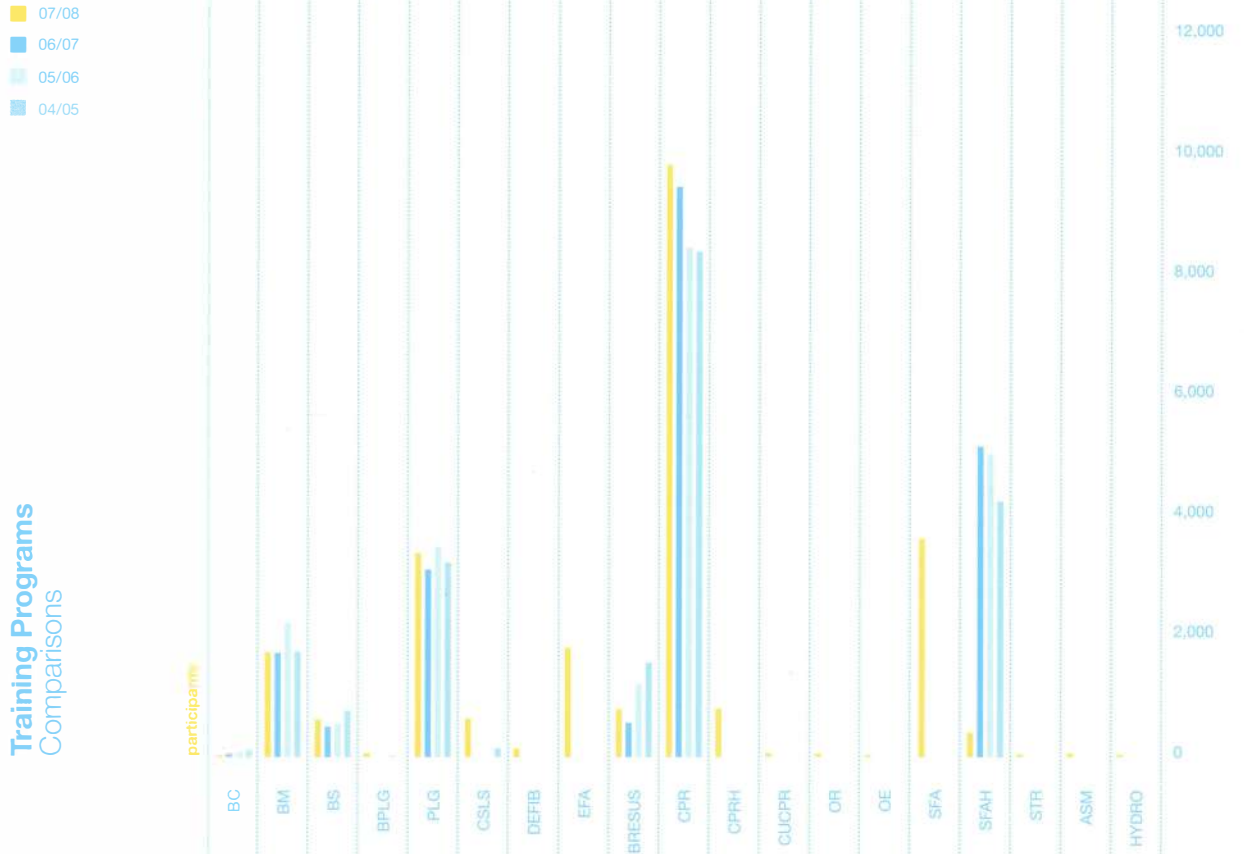

The coming year will see advances in the use of online resources for both training and education purposes.

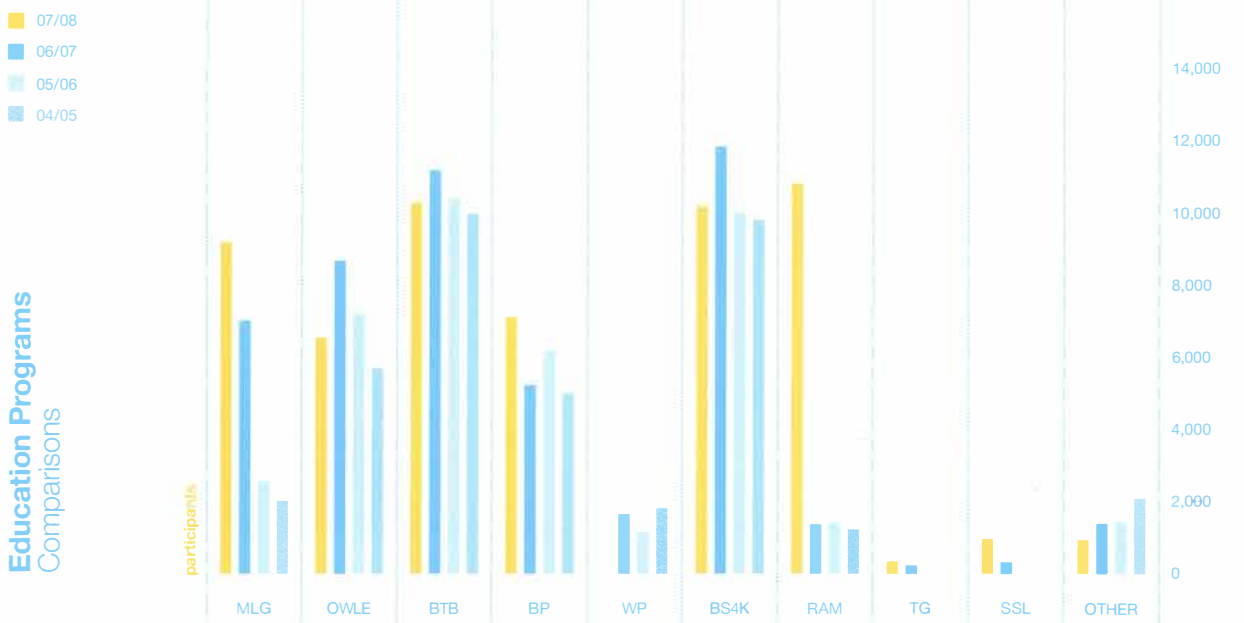

2007/2008 was a hugely successful year for Culturally and Linguistically Diverse projects, growing from one major project in 2006/2007 to five.

The 'Water Connections' Project, focusing on both the Muslim and wider CALD community, was extended for a second year and continued to offer vital water safety messages to participants whilst also enabling them to learn more about their local pools and receive important aquatic industry training.

'Valuing Volunteers' and 'On the Same Wave' projects targeted beach safety, recruitment and more inclusive life saving club practices. More than a thousand youth and adults benefited from these beach focused programs.

Due to the 'Learning for Life' Project held in Hoppers Crossing, seventy children per week (predominantly from the Karen community, Myanmar) are now learning to swim and enthusiastically progressing through Swim and Survive swimming and water safety levels.

Future Projects

In mid 2008, LSV embarked on a two year program that will connect Indigenous youth in East Gippsland with aquatic skills and education. The 'Lakes Entrance Indigenous Aquatics Project' is a combination of all the exciting aquatic activities already mentioned in the projects above with learn to swim, surfing, lifesaving, education programs, training opportunities and various inter school aquatics competitions offered. The 'On The Same Wave Project', currently connecting CALD groups from the Western and South Eastern suburbs of Melbourne, via the help of local 'pilot' Life Saving Clubs such as Edithvale and Altona, will continue into the start of 2009.

CALD children learning to swim in the Werribee/Hoppers Crossing region through 'Learning for Life' will be able to do so for a further three years.

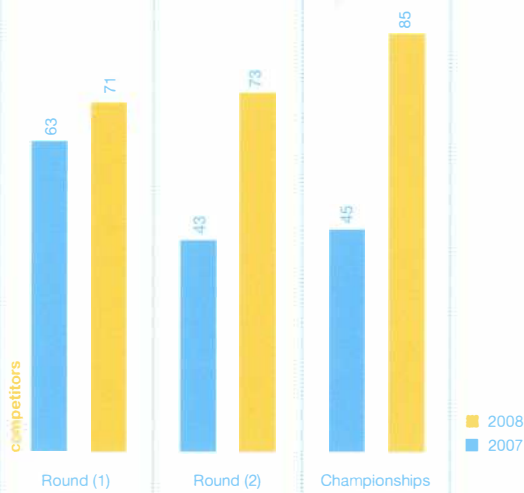
- Expanded High Performance Program including athlete camps

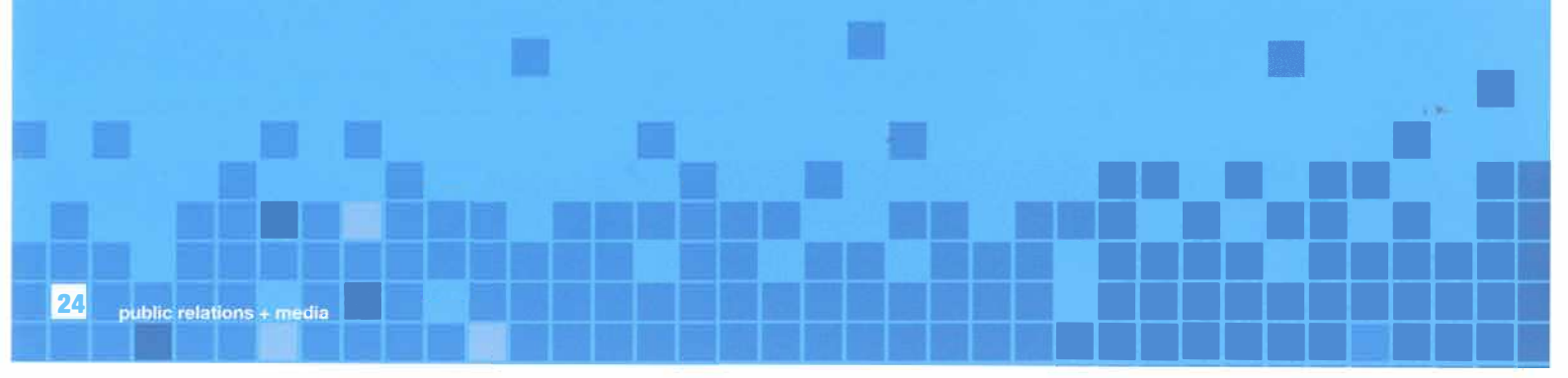
Media + Partnerships

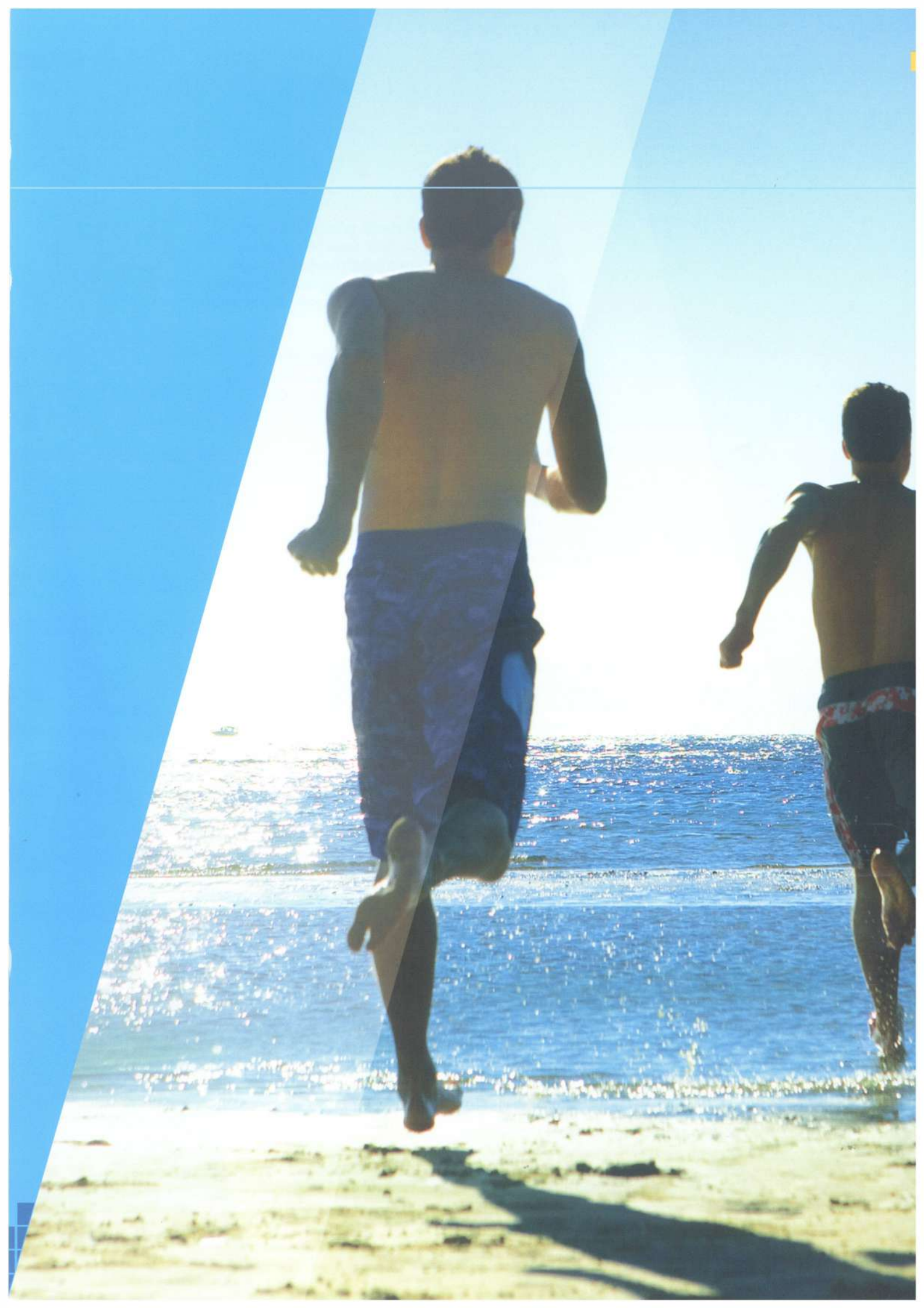

LSV's role as the peak water safety body in Victoria has now been strengthened as it has become the leading partner and provider of promotion of the State Government's Play It Safe By the Water (PISBTW) campaign.

The Communications Team will be building on the success of the National TV show "Surf Patrol" as well as our increased profile due to The Year of the Surf Lifesaver to further lift LSV's profile as part of the Victorian emergency service family. Exciting initiatives in website and communications technology will be used over the coming year to help promote LSV as a vibrant 21st century water safety entity.





aquatic risk

Life Saving Victoria plays a key role in providing facility operators, local government and land managers with expert advice in providing safer aquatic environments for the Victorian community.

Facility Design Guidelines Released

November 2007 saw the release of the updated Facility Design section of the Guidelines for Safe Pool Operations (GSPO).

The release of these guidelines followed significant consultation with the industry and have been warmly embraced by designers and operators alike.

Aquatic Facility Safety Assessment - Computer Based Assessment Software

The development and introduction of computer based assessment software for commercial facility safety assessments has been a key highlight. The automated tool has allowed collation of national data and reduced the time required to complete and deliver assessments to clients. The success of the software will see all coastal and inland assessments be completed on a similar application in the coming year.

Aquatic Facility Safety Assessment – Annual Report

Life Saving Victoria was able to release its first Annual Report of the results gathered during Aquatic Facility Safety Assessment (AFSA). It is expected that this report shall be released annually to the industry to provide a snapshot and the trends of aquatic safety throughout Victoria and nationally.

Aquatic Safety Signage

Aquatic Safety Signage was a key focus for the year. After a significant amount of work, Life Saving Victoria is now providing signage for commercial and natural aquatic environments. This project will have its benefits in the years to come with increased signage, recognition, uniformity and quality across Victoria.

For Aquatic Risk Services, the core focus remains conducting assessments for facility operators, local government and land managers. Our expert advice assists in providing safer aquatic environments for the Victorian community. A total of 110 aquatic assessments were conducted over the last 12 months.

Of the larger open environment projects, 6 coastal locations and 6 inland river and lake locations were conducted. Again LSV have been engaged to conduct assessments in Western Australia, New South Wales and Queensland. Assessments of built environments included 70 AFSA's and an increased number of supervision, signage and specialised risk assessments. Swimming pool and urban designers have been engaging Aquatic Risk Services to provide specialist advice on ensuring their designs meet best-practice standards. LSV completed 8 separate assessments on pool and waterway designs.

Hotel/Motel Pools

In early 2007, RLSSA released the 'Guidelines for Water Safety: Hotel & Motel Pools'. Victoria is home to approx 779 hotel/motels of which 234 have pools. LSV is keen to again take the lead role in promoting water safety in this growing aquatic sector. LSV is in the process of developing partnerships that will hopefully see the aquatic safety message spread to a large new audience.

GSPO Review

The Guidelines for Safe Pool Operation will continue to evolve, with the planned review and updating of three sections of the GSPO. This will be the first time in 12 years that the Programs Section will have been reviewed. This is certain to provide a renewed focus to offering safer aquatic programs.

Training and Research

Aquatic Risk Services are looking to further enhance our growing reputation as leaders in aquatic risk management. LSV are currently developing partnerships with training and education institutions, it is hoped these partnerships will lead to increased awareness of the aquatic safety message and a safety focused workforce.

Key Highlights

The Research and Health Promotion program at Life Saving Victoria continued to develop in 2007/2008 through engagement with our members, the wider community, government and the aquatic industry. Some of the highlights included projects on water safety for Culturally and Linguistically Diverse (CALD) communities, rock fishing safety, boating safety, and supervision in public swimming pools. Piloting of a new interactive Water Safety CD ROM for Victorian Primary School students was also undertaken. Evaluation of all Life Saving Victoria education programs and the 'Play It Safe by the Water' (PISBTW) campaign continued to ensure the effectiveness and uptake of key water safety messages throughout the community.

Analysis of data and information on drowning and water related injury was disseminated to industry, government, media and the general community. Various publications were produced including a peer reviewed journal paper 'Injuries in Public Swimming Pools in Victoria: A Pilot Study'.

Life Saving Victoria staff participated in both National and International conferences including the 2008 Australian Water Safety Conference and the 2007 World Water Safety Conference in Portugal. Life Saving Victoria is also represented on a number of injury prevention committees, working groups and international taskforces.

Key Projects

Watch Around Water Campaign

In response to growing industry concerns regarding the supervision of children whilst visiting aquatic facilities, Life Saving Victoria is working in partnership with Aquatics & Recreation Victoria to promote and deliver the new Watch Around Water program. Watch Around Water aims to educate the Victorian public about what adequate supervision is, and to encourage parents/guardians to take on the responsibility for adequately supervising their children while visiting public aquatic facilities. Support for the Watch Around Water campaign has been provided by the PISBTW campaign.

Angel Ring Pilot Project

Monitoring continues on the Angel Ring Pilot Project. As part of a joint research project with Monash University, Victoria University and Parks Victoria, and in conjunction with LOTE marketing, design and administration of surveys reporting on anglers perceived coastal safety perceptions and behaviours whilst rock fishing was undertaken throughout March-June 2008. The education component of the program was developed and is currently being delivered to high risk population groups with support from the Department of Primary Industries Recreational Fishing Grant Program. In addition, the campaign has and will continue to have a strong presence at major fishing and targeted cultural events, reaching a broader audience Statewide.

Evaluation of Water Safety Education CD-ROM

An interactive water safety CD-ROM program was developed to provide all Victorian Primary School age children with a broad range of information about water safety, from the home to the beach. A total of 1,359 Prep to Grade 6 students, and 53 teachers were surveyed to determine the ease of use, acceptability and learning from the CD-ROM. The results from this pilot project provided important feedback for revision prior to the Statewide launch and distribution of the program. Support for the Water Safety CD-ROM has been provided by the PISBTW campaign.

Evaluation of water safety initiatives for CALD communities

Language and cultural barriers may reduce the accessibility of CALD communities to water safety education and training. This may place members of these groups and those in their care at a greater risk of drowning. Funding was obtained through the VicHealth PICSAR Grants scheme for this project which aims to improve participation in aquatic sport and recreation for people from low socio-economic and CALD communities. Invaluable partnerships have been formed with Belgravia Leisure, The Smith Family, the Western English Language Centre, as well as the wider community, and 70 children are currently participating in the program.

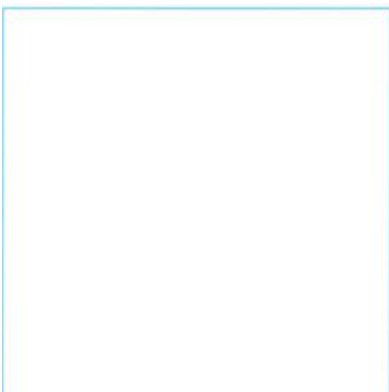
Evaluation of the Boating Safety for Kids program

The Boating Safety for Kids program, developed by Life Saving Victoria in conjunction with Yachting Victoria, and supported by a grant from Marine Safety Victoria, aims to educate Upper Primary School students on trip preparation, safety equipment, PFD usage, dangers in both inland and open waterways, and emergency response. Evaluation of the Boating Safety for Kids program continued in 2007/2008 with the design and development of a Boating Safety for Kids Quiz. The Quiz was designed to assess student knowledge of boating and water safety following the program. Nine intervention schools (289 children) and 8 control schools (567 children) completed the quiz. Children in the intervention group had significantly greater levels of knowledge about trip preparation, safety equipment, checking the weather, and most aspects of emergency responses compared with controls following the 'Boating Safety for Kids' theory session.

Future Developments

LSV Member Survey

The proposed project will assess the current relationship between LSV and their affiliated members. It will provide for an ongoing measurement of performance against a preliminary baseline.

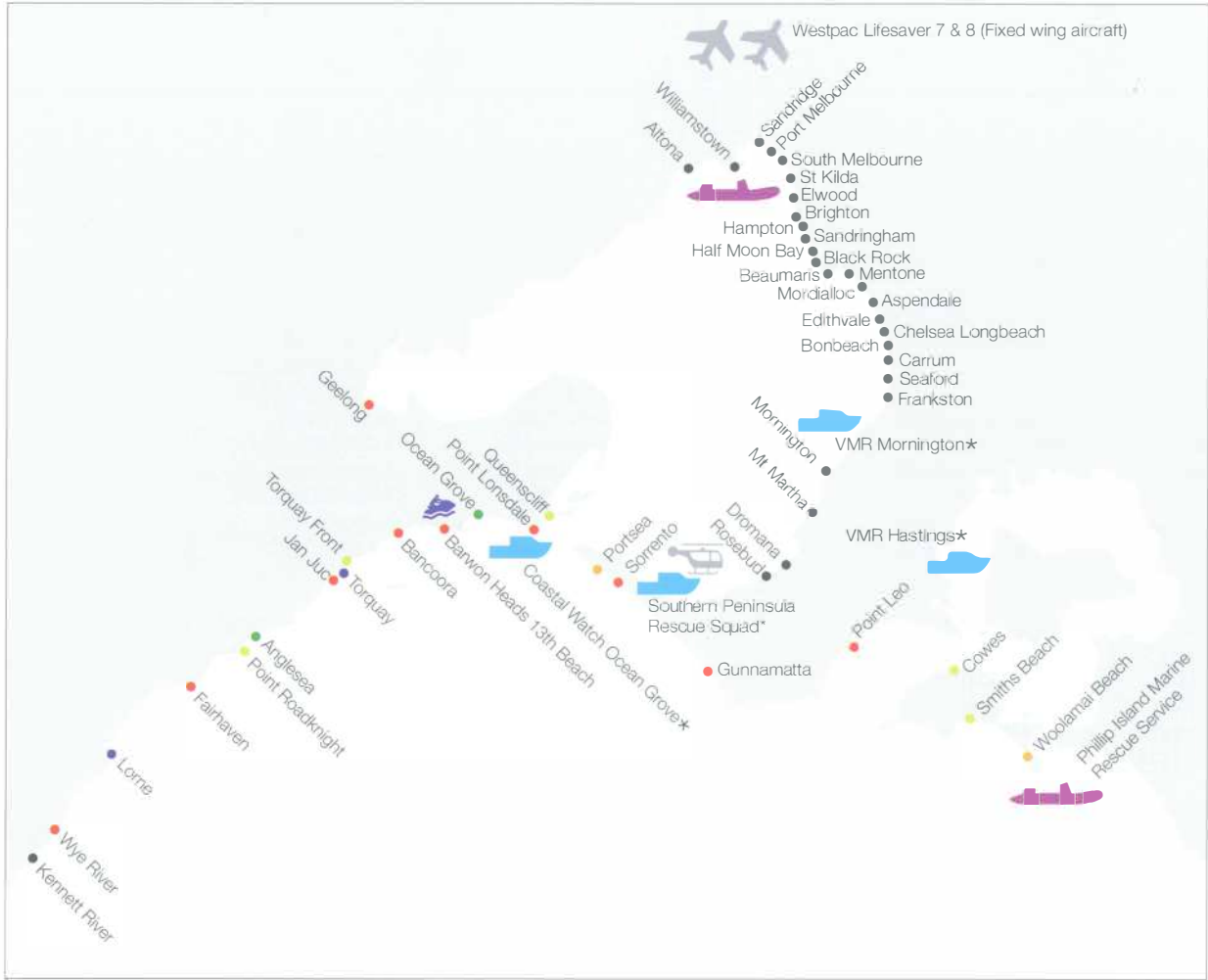

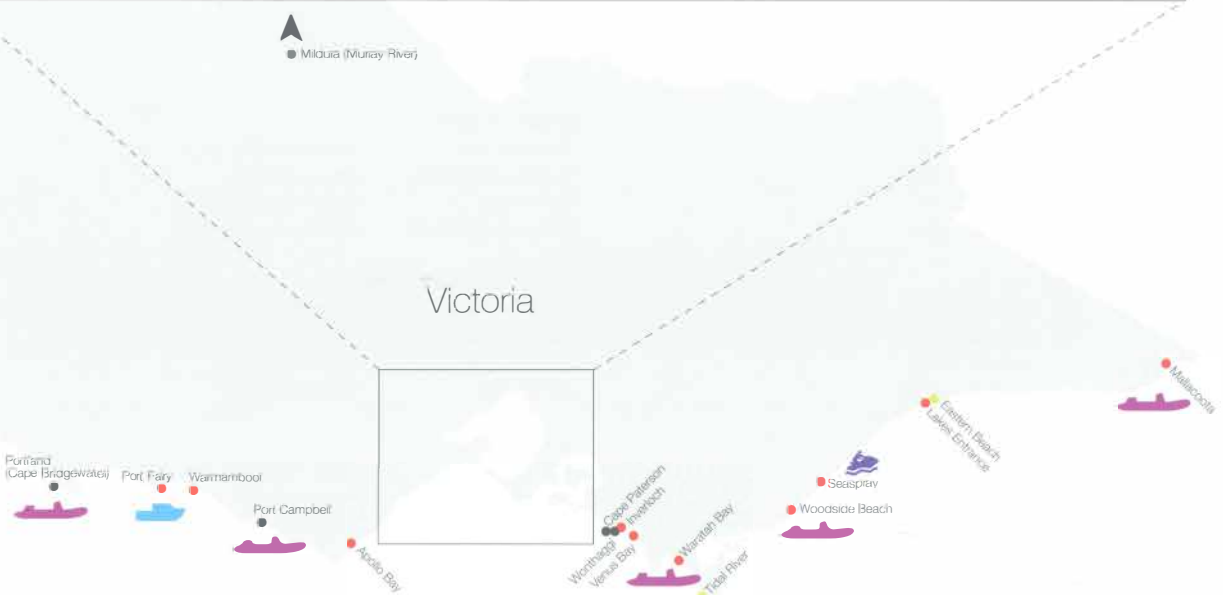

Financial Result + Review of Operations

The financial activities for Life Saving Victoria (LSV) for 2007-08 resulted in a consolidated surplus, before building amortisation, for the economic entity of \$107,411 (\$634,364 for 2006-07). The net result for 2007-08 after building amortisation was a loss of \$215,278 (surplus of \$311,675 for 2006-07). In comparing the results of the two years it should be noted that 2006-07 included the one-off benefit of a realised gain of \$497,232 from the sale of the Oakleigh premises.

In the following statements the economic entity includes all financial transactions for LSV and related entities, including the wind up of the Dandenong Oasis Aquatic and Leisure Centre. The financial statements for the parent entity exclude the Dandenong Oasis financial transactions.

The contract for the management of the Dandenong Oasis Aquatic and Leisure Centre concluded on 30 June 2006. During 2007-08 a settlement was negotiated with the City of Greater Dandenong in respect of certain outstanding financial matters. Subsequently the legal entity established for the management of the Centre, the Australian Water Safety Education Centre Pty Ltd was wound up and the company deregistered.

LSV continues to be heavily reliant on grant funding and this represents some 45% of total income.

LSV's role as Victoria's peak water safety body was again reinforced and all "Play It Safe by the Water Program" grant monies from the Victorian State Government were paid to LSV. Grants disbursed to other program participants in 2007-2008 totalled \$605,000 (\$525,000 in 2006-07).

The State Government provided \$650,000 in new funding for a range of Culturally and Linguistically Diverse projects. In 2007-08 \$325,000 was applied with the remaining \$325,000 to be utilised in 2008-09.

2007-08 represented year two of a three year grant funding program in conjunction with the Australian Government for the establishment and operation of the Australian Lifesaving Academy. The program aims to implement a structured training and education framework that is expected to be self sufficient by year four. A total of \$490,000 was received (\$500,000 in 2006-07) and applied for this purpose.

The function centre and café activities in the new building commenced operation in October 2006 and are conducted under a joint venture arrangement between LSV and the Box Hill Institute of TAFE. The business experienced considerable growth resulting in both parties contributing an additional \$20,000 of working capital. Activities for 2007-08 resulted in a small surplus.

The increase in interest income reflects several factors including a full year's investment of the proceeds of the Oakleigh premises and higher interest rates.

Prior Period Error

The year end reconciliation process identified that revenue for the year ended 30 June 2007 was overstated by \$79,335 as a result of an IT programming issue which resulted in the duplication of invoices.

Dividends

The Memorandum of Association for LSV provides that no income or property of the entity, shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividends to the members. Accordingly no dividend has been declared or paid since incorporation.

Subsequent Events

Since the end of the financial year and the date of this report no significant transaction or events have occurred.
